## Answer:

The then Director-General of Licensing, through officers from the Department of Business Licensing NT division, undertook consultations in the community over a six month period.

The NT Liquor Act provides that the Director-General of Licensing may require the applicant to 'publish notice' of the application if it is considered to be in the public interest.

The then Director-General of Licensing accepted that having taken into account the significant community and stake-holder engagement over a long period, the size and nature of the population and the effective 'word of mouth' dissemination of information within the community that would be affected, no public interest would be served in having the applicant provide further notification of the application by way of advertising.
