Our data indicates that there have been no Central Land Council rangers transferred into Parks and Wildlife jobs permanently. Last year, two Tjuwanpa rangers worked on the Finke Gorge National Park for six months as a successful exchange initiative. The Parks Service has recruited Indigenous rangers into their training program from the Ingkerreke ranger group with whom it also enjoys a productive ranger capacity-building partnership.
