


## July 1, 1978 Self Government day

### Self government means:

The Federal parliament passed legislation that provided for the Legislative Assembly of the Northern Territory

- to make laws for the peace, order and good governance of the Northern Territory
- that every proposed law passed by the Legislative Assembly shall be presented to the Administrator for assent
