Answer: Staffing details for the NTAGO are as follows:

- a) as at 30 June 2020, the NTAGO had a total of 3.5FTE due to a vacancy following an employee transfer and an employee on extended leave:

- (1) As at 30 June the position of Manager Finance and Corporate Services was vacant due to the person who had previously held the position being permanently transferred to another agency and the recruitment process to fill the position was still underway. The established headcount for this classification is 2.0FTE in this area.
- (2) One of the Principal Auditors was on part-pay parental leave for part of the year. Their absence was partially covered on a part-time temporary basis during part of the absence this time however this part-time role had ceased as at 30 June 2020. The established headcount for this classification is 3.0FTE in this area.

Answer: The NTAGO has outsourced the majority of audit tasks since the Office was established in 1982. Outsourcing costs related to the delivery of audit services is classified as consultancy costs. The panel of providers for the current audit services contract, which became effective 2 January 2018 for a period of 36 months comprises seven audit firms (BDO Audit, Deloitte Touche Tohmatsu, KPMG, Merit Partners, TDH Chartered Accountants, Nexia Edwards Marshall and Lowry’s Accountants).
