QUESTION:

Has anyone been evicted for anti-social behaviour from a town camp or a remote community or a homeland that you are in control of?

ANSWER:

There have been no evictions for anti-social behaviour (ASB) through the Northern Territory Civil and Administrative Tribunal (NTCAT) across all remote communities, town camps, and homelands.

The Department of Territory Families, Housing and Communities (the Department) will continue an active focus on supporting public housing tenancies, particularly where unreasonable and excessive antisocial behaviour ASB is impacting neighbourhood and community harmony.

The Chief Executive Officer (CEO) (Housing) will seek termination of a tenancy as a last resort and will work with the tenant to meet their responsibilities under their tenancy agreement and the *Residential Tenancies Act 1999* (RTA).
