- 1. How many houses and flats does the Northern Territory Housing Commission own in the greater Darwin area.
- 2. How many of the houses are vacant.
- 3. For how long has each house been vacant.
- 4. Have any of the houses been vacant for over 3 months; if so, why.
- 5. How many of the flats are vacant.
- 6. For how long has each flat been vacant.
- 7. Have any of the flats been vacant for over 3 months; if so, why.

ANSWER

- 1. The Housing Commission owns 3634 houses and 1796 flats in the Darwin area.
- 2. 88 of the houses were vacant as at 6 October 1993.
- 3. The average house vacancy period for those houses is 35 days.
- 4. 10 of the houses have been vacant for over 3 months. Reasons are -
 - (a) 2 houses awaiting disposal;
 - (b) 1 house repossessed and delays were incurred having ex-tenants remove their possessions to allow maintenance to commence;
 - (c) 1 specially-modified dwelling awaiting a tenant who has the requirement;
 - (d) 1 dwelling having special modifications carried out to meet the specific needs of the tenant and family;

- (e) 1 dwelling extensively damaged by previous tenants;
- (f) 1 dwelling undergoing upgrade; and
- (g) 3 dwellings were vacated in the Casuarina area just prior to cessation of vacate maintenance contractor. Delays occurred until commencement of the new contractor.
- 5. 96 of the flats were vacant as at 6 October 1993.
- 6. Average vacancy period for these flats is 39 days.
- 7. 12 of the flats have been vacant for more than 3 months for the following reasons -
 - (a) 1 flat burnt by tenant;
 - (b) 1 flat required full repaint;
 - (c) 3 flats held over pending relocation of tenants from other flats requiring upgrade;
 - (d) 1 flat in an unpopular location rejected by numerous prospective tenants;
 - (e) 1 flat due to an unnotified and undetected vacancy; and
 - (f) 5 flats vacant awaiting major upgrade.
