CENSURE OF CHIEF MINISTER 5.

Ms Lawrie (Leader of the Opposition) moved - This House censures the Chief Minister for his dismal attempt at leadership in the Northern Territory and his failure to stand up for Territorians including:

- Refusing to discipline the Member for Greatorex over his abuse and bullying behaviour 1. towards the Member for Namatjira;
- 2. Ignoring a letter of complaint about the Member for Port Darwin from the Member from Arnhem;

- 3. Failing to deliver on any of his bush promises and breaking the trust of indigenous Territorians;
- 4. Hiking up the cost of living for all Territorians by increasing power prices; and
- 5. The disgraceful knifing of former Chief Minister Terry Mills and then lying about it.
