5. CENSURE OF CHIEF MINISTER - MOTION NOT AGREED TO

Mr McCarthy (Member for Barkly) moved — That this House censure the Chief Minister for:

- Lying to this Parliament and lying to Territorians about his knowledge of the CLP slush fund Foundation 51;
- Lying to this Parliament and lying to Territorians about the relationship between the CLP and Foundation 51;
- Refusing to come clean about his knowledge and involvement in the CLP slush fund Foundation 51 despite clear evidence of numerous conversations with one of the funds directors, Graeme Lewis;
- Attempting to cover up his lies by refusing to have a full and public inquiry into the activities
 of CLP slush fund Foundation 51; and
- Arrogantly refusing to send a referral to the Legal and Constitutional Affairs Committee to find the best way to establish a corruption commission to ensure transparency in the political donation system in the Territory.

Mr Elferink (Leader of Government Business) informed the Assembly that the Government would accept the censure motion, pursuant to Standing Order 95.
