

## Attachment A

### Central Australia Region

- In the Northern Territory (NT) the National Indigenous Australians (NIAA) is committed to local and regional decision making and supports the NT Government's Local Decision Making (LDM) including entering into several Multi-Agency Partnership agreements.
- NIAA is has not entered into formal agreements in Central Australia but supports existing LDM agreements where it can.
- In Alice Springs, the Tangentyere Council Aboriginal Corporation (TCAC) and the NT Government entered into an LDM agreement for the benefit of Alice Springs Town Camps. NIAA is working collaboratively with TCAC and the NT Government to implement local priorities consistent with the LDM overarching principles.
- A draft LDM Commitment Agreement between the NT Government and local Alice Springs Traditional Owner Group Lhere Artepe Aboriginal Corporation (LAAC) is also in development. A key outcome is expected to be an Indigenous Land Use Agreement (ILUA) for parcels of land in Alice Springs in exchange for a package of benefits for Arrernte people. NIAA is involved in supporting the governance capacity of LAAC to lead negotiations about the ILUA.
- NIAA also supports several other local and regional decision making mechanisms in the Central Australia and the Barkley regions, these include:
  - The Barkly Regional Deal.
  - Empowered Communities – In the NT tri-state border region with South and Western Australian, we support Empowered Communities for the Ngaanyatjarra Pitjantjatjara Yankunytjatjara (NPY) lands.
  - Mutitjulu Township Leasing Consultative Forum hosted by the Office of Township Leasing with Traditional Owners
