1. How many young people attended the Palmerston Youth Skills Centre (PYSC) in the 2021-22 financial year? Please specify by age group.

328 students attended PYSC in the 2021-22 financial year.

2. How many of the young people who attended the Palmerston Youth Skills Centre in the 2021-22 financial year were considered 'at-risk' of entering the justice system? How many had already been involved in the justice system?

27 students were reported as having been involved in the justice system through the referral process to the PYSC. However, it is important to note that PYSC has anecdotal evidence that other young people who were not flagged through this referral process are in some way involved in the justice system. Evidence includes:

- relationships with students and families
- regular communication with the Department of Education's court liaison officers
- the visibility of the Department of Territory Families, Housing and Communities (TFHC) daily census which includes students' names and involvement in the justice system.

The department does not have a systemic measure of students 'at-risk of entering the justice system'.

3. How many of the young people who attended the Palmerston Youth Skills Centre in the 2021-22 financial year did so as part of a court order, diversion program, condition of bail, or some other referral as part of the justice system? Please specify by category.

4. How many of the young people who attended the Palmerston Youth Skills Centre in the 2021-22 financial year commenced a training course? Of these, how many have completed their course? How many failed to complete their course?

198 students enrolled in accredited training courses, 115 students gained full qualifications during this period and 14 students are continuing on with their training.

51 students achieved one or more units of competency and 18 students had no results.

130 additional students have engaged in try a trade who are not represented in the enrolment numbers above.

Please note that this is program data reported from PYSC for the purposes of responding to this question and that the 2022 systemic data reporting has not commenced.
