## 1(d) Funding per enrolled student:

Funding per enrolled student is based on what is reported in MySchool and is publicly available on the internet. MySchool data includes total Northern Territory and Australian Government recurrent funding, fees and charges and other income from other sources attributed to schools and is based on enrolments at August Age Grade Census.

2022 MySchool data is not yet available as timeframes for submission of this data is not yet due and it is currently under preparation.

2023 MySchool data is not yet available. This data collection for enrolled students is due to be collected in the August Age Grade Census and the funding/expenditure is assessed after the completion of the school year.
