Alice Springs based staff are responsible for undertaking the functions of the Authority in that specifically relate to the Central Australian region including:

- undertake anthropological research and associated administration and consultation with custodians to register sacred sites;
- issue Authority Certificates in consultation with custodians and applicants:
- consult with custodians in relation to site damage;
- manage the conflict between protecting sacred sites and land development that can arise between custodians and clients;
- carry out field surveys and research to determine the constraints, if any, imposed by the existence of sacred sites for work on land within the Central Australian region; and
- enforce the Northern Territory Aboriginal Sacred Sites Act 1989 and all legal requirements.

From 1 July 2023 to 31 March 2024 the Alice Springs Office:

- Completed 19 Authority Certificates valued at \$0.819 million in charges;
- Recorded 35 new sacred sites; and
- Registered 9 new sacred sites.
