Inquiry into options for the Reform of Political Funding and Donations in the Northern Territory

Commissioner John Mansfield AM QC held appointment as Justice of the Federal Court from 1996 until 2016. He was appointed Queen's Counsel for South Australia in 1985 and the Northern Territory in 1988. He also served as President of various law societies and councils, and between 1991 and 1993 he held the role of assisting the Commissioner for the Royal Commission into the State Bank of South Australia.

- d) Royal Commission into the Protection and Detention of Children in the Northern Territory is a joint Commonwealth / Northern Territory Inquiry of approximately \$54 million. The Commonwealth and Northern Territory governments have committed to share the costs equally. Costs as at 31 March 2018 is \$14 million.

The cost of Scientific Inquiry into Hydraulic Fracturing of Onshore Unconventional Reservoirs and Associated Activities in the Northern Territory as at 31 March 2018 is \$3.6 million.

As at 31 March 2018, cost relating to Inquiry into options for the Reform of Political Funding and Donations in the Northern Territory is \$100 000.

- e) Royal Commission into the Protection and Detention of Children in the Northern Territory

The Commission held seven sets of public hearings in Darwin and Alice Springs during which time they heard from 214 witnesses including 24 vulnerable witnesses, conducted 11 case studies, heard 16 recorded personal stories and received more than 480 witness statements. There were 13 public meetings held in the Northern Territory to hear directly from people affected by the youth detention and child protection systems, 13 roundtables and targeted meetings, notices to produce were served on various government agencies and public submissions were received.

The Scientific Inquiry into Hydraulic Fracturing of Onshore Unconventional Reservoirs and Associated Activities in the Northern Territory

The Inquiry released three documents for public consultation: *Background and Issues Paper*, *Interim Report* and a *Draft Final Report*.

The Inquiry held 52 community forums in regards to the three documents it released for public consultation in the following towns and communities: Darwin, Katherine, Tenant Creek, Alice Springs, Humpty Doo, Maningrida, Gapuwiyak, Nhulunbuy, Ngukurr, Elliott, Borroloola, Daly Waters, Mataranka, Jilkminggan, Timber Creek, Hermannsburg and Yuendumu.

The Inquiry conducted 151 public hearings in Darwin, Katherine, Tennant Creek and Alice Springs.

The Inquiry received 1257 public submissions. All submissions and public hearings transcripts and available on the Inquiry's website.

The Inquiry published 31 Community Updates on its activities and consultation efforts.

The Inquiry published its *Final Report of the Scientific Inquiry into Hydraulic Fracturing in the Northern Territory*.

Inquiry into options for the Reform of Political Funding and Donations in the Northern Territory

The Inquiry commenced with a public call for preliminary submissions on matters within the Terms of Reference via print media. Approximately 50 letters were also sent to persons or organisations who may have an interest in the Inquiry. A discussion paper was released on 20 October 2017 with a request for comments, feedback or submissions. The Commissioner has also held meetings with stakeholders, organisations, public officers, MLA's, Ministers and media representatives.

Royal Commission into the Protection and Detention of Children in the Northern Territory

The Final Report (the Report) was tabled in Federal Parliament Out-of-Session on the 17 November 2017. It was tabled in the Northern Territory Legislative Assembly on the 21 November 2017. The Report contains more than 2000 pages within six volumes with 142 findings and made 226 recommendations.

The Scientific Inquiry into Hydraulic Fracturing of Onshore Unconventional Reservoirs and Associated Activities in the Northern Territory

On 27 March 2018, the Inquiry publicly released its Final Report and handed it to the Chief Minister of the Northern Territory. The Final Report is 1259 pages and contains 135 recommendations. All members of the Legislative Assembly were afforded the opportunity to attend a comprehensive briefing by the Inquiry on the Final Report.

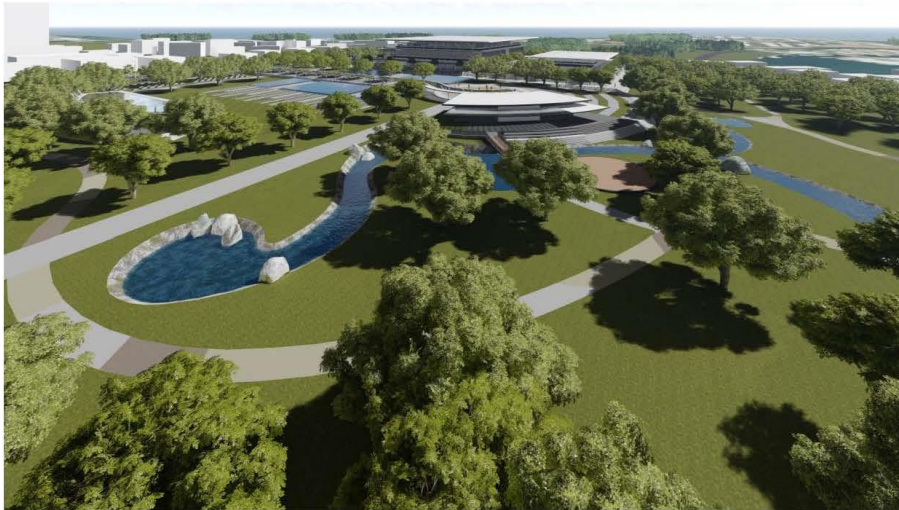

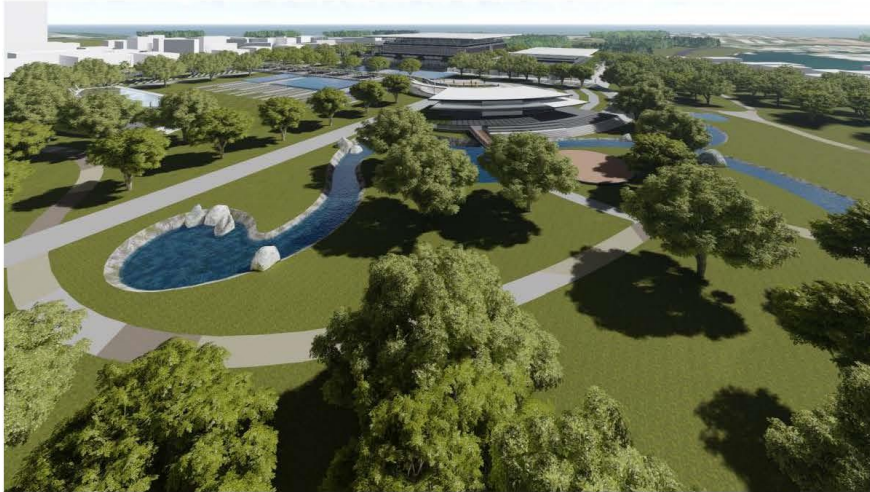

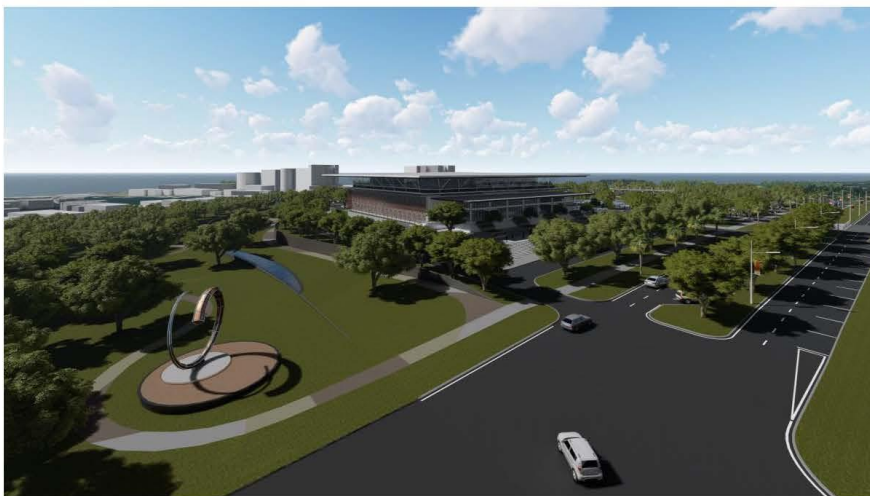

**Terms of Reference**

---

The Northern Territory Government has clear priorities to create jobs, invest in children, support and create community safety, support innovative health care and improve health and hospital services, deliver for the bush and enhance the Territory lifestyle of all Territorians.

A vibrant and sustainable non-government (NGO) sector that partners with Governments at all levels (NT Government, Australian Government and local Government) to deliver quality, culturally appropriate, place based services is fundamental to achieving these social reform priorities.

The NGO and NT Government partnership group (NNPG) is an experienced group of decision makers from within the NGO sector and NT Government who can assist both Government and the sector to build shared capacity and sustainability to meet the challenges the Territory faces in meeting these priorities.

Specifically the NNPG will provide coordinated executive level leadership across government and the sector to:

- facilitate and proactively manage the relationship between the NT Government and the NGO Sector;
- identify connections and strengthen working relationships to assist with implementation of the NT Governments social reform agenda; and
- share, develop and embed best practice for government and sector engagement, and for capacity building.

**1. Principles**

The Statement of Principles (at attachment A) will underpin all activities undertaken and advice provided by the NNPG.

**2. Goals**

The goals of the NNPG will be to:

- enhance partnerships and connections between the NT Government and NGO sector to underpin the Government's social reform agenda, for example on issues such as early childhood development, child and youth health and wellbeing, youth justice and child protection, housing and homelessness, alcohol policy, family violence and community safety;
- influence and add value to whole-of-government and NGO activities to build capacity for implementation of these reform agendas;
- facilitate engagement between NTG agencies and the NGO sector at a senior level; and
- identify emerging issues and opportunities for both the NT Government and NGO sector.

### **3. Scope**

- The NNPG may decide an issue or opportunity needs to be addressed by establishing a working group with the right representation from NTG agencies and the NGO sector.
- The NNPG may involve non-member partners outside the NNPG membership in working groups as required.
- The NNPG may recommend projects to be undertaken.
- The NNPG is a strategic group and not responsible for service delivery.
- The NNPG will not assume responsibilities that would otherwise lie with NTG line agencies and NGO agencies.

### **4. Resources/Budget**

- Secretariat support will be provided by the Department of the Chief Minister.
- The NNPG itself has no operational budget.

### **5. Governance**

- Meetings will be Co - chaired between the Department of the Chief Minister and a member from the NGO sector;
- NNPG meetings will be held at least bi-monthly (with an option to schedule more frequent meetings if required);
- The NNPG Annual Workplan and reporting will be through the appropriate governance structure (yet to be finalised) recognising that there is not an equivalent governance structure for the NGO sector; and
- The NNPG will prepare advice for and inform the Chief Minister's six monthly meetings with the NGO sector.

### **6. Membership**

Membership of the NNPG:

- is based on non-government organisations with significant relationships across the NT Government and vice versa, whose programs support communities and promote participation, in order to improve social connections between people with different backgrounds, language groups, genders and ages;
- will have equal numbers of NTG and NGO members.
- will be reviewed every three years. NGO membership will be determined through an expression of interest.
- Individual representatives of NT Government Agencies and NGOs on the NNPG must be at Director level or above with relevant skills and wide experience in NGO - NT Government relationships. Any delegated proxy for a member attending a meeting will have the same level of authority, expertise and understanding to contribute to discussions and make decisions.

## **7. Attendance**

Members are expected to attend all meetings or to nominate and brief an appropriate proxy to attend in their absence.

Apologies are required and must be submitted to the NNPG Secretariat prior to the meeting. Membership will be reviewed by the Co-Chairs where there has been non-attendance without notification or proxy for more than two consecutive meetings.

## **8. Quorum**

For the purposes of decision making, a quorum will be required. Meetings may proceed without a quorum, but decisions cannot be made and must be ratified by an NNPG quorum at a future meeting or through some other process outside of the meeting.

A quorum will be 50% of the membership including half of both the NTG and NGO members plus one.

## **9. Confidentiality**

NNPG may at times be provided with access to confidential information. Where information is provided or discussed and is identified as being of a confidential nature, it will be noted as such in the minutes of the meeting. In these circumstances, it will be necessary for NNPG members to take all reasonable steps to ensure that confidential information is kept confidential.

## **10. Communication**

The NNPG Secretariat will prepare a record of the meeting outcomes after each meeting. This record will be distributed to NNPG members for wider circulation.

## Northern Territory Government & Non-Government Community Services Sector Statement of Principles

The Northern Territory Government and the NGO Community Services Sector will work together according to these principles in order to provide quality, culturally appropriate, place based services for Territorians.

1. **Achieving the best outcomes** – the goal of government policies and programs, and the prime objective of those organisations that implement them, is to ensure that service delivery maximises public value and improves the quality of life of, and empowers the people and the communities who use them.
2. **Partnership** – a culture of partnership between and within, the NT Government, other funding bodies and the NGO sector is required for effective and sustainable service delivery. The collaborative relationships should be founded on appreciation of the constraints under which all organisations operate and include the following values:
  - **Mutual respect and reciprocated trust**
  - **Authentic consultation and genuine collaboration**
  - **Recognition of a common purpose**
  - **Strengthening and restoring local decision making**
3. **Accountability** – public accountability should focus on outcome performance rather than simply complying with process, with an emphasis on the effective use of funding to achieve agreed outcomes and on measuring the longer-term social impact of programs and services. Accountability will include a commitment to strong governance and quality systems. The burden of reporting should be minimised and streamlined.
4. **Provider diversity** – diversity of community service organisations, including Aboriginal controlled organisations, is recognised as desirable with the range of providers being a strength that delivers greater choice of programs either individually or in partnership to respond to the needs of the community in different ways.
5. **Program and service design** - policy, program development and service delivery should work progressively towards the following:
  - **A holistic approach** – the elements of multiple disadvantage are complex and so support services provided should be ‘joined-up’ and ‘wrapped-around’ the individual or family in need.
  - **Program flexibility** – services should be evidence-based, culturally appropriate and responsive to the distinctive needs of the individual, community group or region and tailored to the particular circumstances. Where evidence is unavailable, services should be based on a risk assessment business case that allows and encourages innovation.
  - **Citizen responsibility** – individuals, families and communities who require support or are affected by community programs and services should be encouraged and empowered to take greater control and responsibility of the services they require to live a full and independent life.
  - **Primary prevention and early action** – the immediate need for expenditure on tertiary services must be acknowledged, however, there should be also be a focus on investment in primary prevention and early action.

- **Shared governance and co-design** – all providers of publicly-funded services (whether public service agencies, not-for-profit organisations, Aboriginal community controlled organisations, social enterprises or private businesses) should be regarded as ‘co-designers’ of government services, jointly contributing to service design and sharing responsibility for program delivery and evaluation.
- **Long-term outcomes** – services should focus on the long-term benefits for the individual, community group or region.

WE do, by Our Letters Patent issued in Our name by Our Administrator of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia on the advice of the Federal Executive Council and under the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Australia, the *Royal Commissions Act 1902* and every other enabling power, appoint you to be a Commission of inquiry, and require and authorise you, to inquire into the following matters:

- (a) failings in the child protection and youth detention systems of the Government of the Northern Territory during the period since the commencement of the *Youth Justice Act* of the Northern Territory (the *relevant period*);
- (b) the treatment, during the relevant period, of children and young persons detained at youth detention facilities administered by the Government of the Northern Territory (the *relevant facilities*), including the Don Dale Youth Detention Centre in Darwin;
- (c) whether any such treatment during the relevant period may:
  - (i) amount to a breach of a law of the Commonwealth; or
  - (ii) amount to a breach of a law in force in the Northern Territory; or
  - (iii) amount to a breach of a duty of care, or any other legal duty, owed by the Government of the Northern Territory to a person detained at any of the relevant facilities; or

- (iv) be inconsistent with, or contrary to, a human right or freedom that:
    - (A) is embodied in a law of the Commonwealth or of the Northern Territory; and
    - (B) is recognised or declared by an international instrument; or
  - (v) amount to a breach of a rule, policy, procedure, standard or management practice that applied to any or all of the relevant facilities;
- (d) both:
- (i) what oversight mechanisms and safeguards (if any) were in place during the relevant period at the relevant facilities to ensure that the treatment of children and young persons detained is appropriate; and
  - (ii) whether those oversight mechanisms and safeguards have failed, or are failing, to prevent inappropriate treatment, and if so, why;
- (e) whether, during the relevant period, there were deficiencies in the organisational culture, structure or management in, or in relation to, any or all of the relevant facilities;
- (f) whether, during the relevant period, more should have been done by the Government of the Northern Territory to take appropriate measures to prevent the recurrence of inappropriate treatment of children and young persons detained at the relevant facilities and, in particular, to act on the recommendations of past reports and reviews, including:
- (i) the Review of the Northern Territory Youth Detention System Report, of January 2015; and
  - (ii) the Report of the Office of the Children's Commissioner of the Northern Territory about services at Don Dale Youth Detention Centre, of August 2015;



- (g) what measures should be adopted by the Government of the Northern Territory, or enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the Northern Territory, to prevent inappropriate treatment of children and young persons detained at the relevant facilities, including:
  - (i) law reform; and
  - (ii) reform of administrative practices; and
  - (iii) reform of oversight measures and safeguards; and
  - (iv) reform of management practices, education, training and suitability of officers; and
  - (v) any other relevant matters;
- (h) what improvements could be made to the child protection system of the Northern Territory, including the identification of early intervention options and pathways for children at risk of engaging in anti-social behaviour;
- (i) the access, during the relevant period, by children and young persons detained at the relevant facilities, to appropriate medical care, including psychiatric care;
- (j) any matter reasonably incidental to a matter mentioned in paragraphs (a) to (i).

AND We further declare that you are not required by these Our Letters Patent to inquire, or to continue to inquire, into a particular matter to the extent that you are satisfied that the matter has been, is being, or will be, sufficiently and appropriately dealt with by another inquiry or investigation or a criminal or civil proceeding.

AND, without limiting the scope of your inquiry or the scope of any recommendations arising out of your inquiry that you may consider appropriate, We direct you, for the purposes of your inquiry and recommendations, to consider the following matters, and We authorise you to take (or refrain from taking) any action that you consider appropriate arising out of your consideration:

- (k) the need to establish mechanisms to facilitate the timely communication of information, or the furnishing of evidence, documents or things, in accordance with section 6P of the *Royal Commissions Act 1902* or any other relevant law, including, for example, for the purpose of enabling the timely investigation and prosecution of offences;
- (l) the need to ensure that evidence that may be received by you that identifies particular individuals as having been subject to inappropriate treatment is dealt with in a way that does not prejudice current or future criminal or civil proceedings or other contemporaneous inquiries;
- (m) the need to establish appropriate arrangements in relation to current and previous inquiries, in Australia and elsewhere, for evidence and information to be shared with you in ways consistent with relevant obligations so that the work of those inquiries, including, with any necessary consents, the testimony of witnesses, can be taken into account by you in a way that avoids unnecessary duplication, improves efficiency and avoids unnecessary trauma to witnesses.

AND We direct you to make any recommendations arising out of your inquiry that you consider appropriate.

AND We appoint you, the Honourable Margaret Jean White AO, to be the Chair of the Commission.

AND We declare that you are a relevant Commission for the purposes of sections 4 and 5 of the *Royal Commissions Act 1902*.

AND We declare that you are authorised to conduct your inquiry into any matter under these Our Letters Patent in combination with any inquiry into the same matter, or a matter related to that matter, that you are directed or authorised to conduct by any Commission, or under any order or appointment, made by the Government or a Minister of the Northern Territory.

AND We declare that in these Our Letters Patent:

*child* means a person under the age of 18 years, and *children* has a corresponding meaning.

AND We:

- (n) require you to begin your inquiry as soon as practicable; and
- (o) require you to make your inquiry as expeditiously as possible; and
- (p) require you to submit to Our Governor-General a report of the results of your inquiry, and your recommendations, not later than 31 March 2017.

## TERMS OF REFERENCE

### BACKGROUND

On 14 September the Northern Territory Government announced a scientific inquiry into hydraulic fracturing of onshore unconventional reservoirs in the Northern Territory (the **Inquiry**) under the *Inquiries Act (NT)*.

### DEFINITIONS

For the purposes of this document:

“Associated Activities” means:

- (a) the acquisition of ground or surface water for hydraulic fracturing;
- (b) the mixing of water, chemicals and proppant to create hydraulic fracturing fluid;
- (c) the return of injected fluid and water produced from the unconventional reservoir to the surface after hydraulic fracturing, and subsequent transport for reuse, treatment or disposal; and
- (d) the reuse, treatment and release of wastewater generated by hydraulic fracturing.

“environment” means land, air, water, organisms and ecosystems and includes:

- (a) the well-being of humans;
- (b) structures made or modified by humans;
- (c) the amenity values of an area; and
- (d) economic, cultural and social conditions.

“environmental impact” means any change, or potential change, to the environment.

“environmental risk” means the chance of something happening that will have an environmental impact, measured in terms of the environmental consequences and the likelihood of those consequences occurring.

“hydraulic fracturing” means the injection of fluids under pressures high enough to fracture the gas bearing formation where the fluid is comprised of water, chemicals and proppant.

“unconventional reservoir” is a reservoir where the gas bearing formation is shale.

### TERMS OF REFERENCE

The Inquiry will:

1. assess the scientific evidence to determine the nature and extent of the environmental impacts and risks, including the cumulative impacts and risks, associated with hydraulic fracturing of unconventional reservoirs and the Associated Activities in the Northern Territory;
2. advise on the nature of any knowledge gaps and additional work or research that is required to make the determination in Item 1, including a program for how such work or research should be prioritised and implemented, that includes (but is not limited to);
  - a. baseline surface water and groundwater studies,
  - b. baseline fugitive emissions data,

- c. geological and fault line mapping, and
  - d. focus areas for baseline health impact assessment,
3. for every environmental risk and impact that is identified in Item 1, advise the level of environmental impact and risk that would be considered acceptable in the Northern Territory context;
  4. for every environmental risk and impact that is identified in Item 1,
    - a. describe methods, standards or strategies that can be used to reduce the impact or risk; and
    - b. advise whether such methods, standards or strategies can effectively and efficiently reduce the impact or risk to the levels described in Item 3;
  5. identify any scientific, technical, policy or regulatory requirements or resources that are in addition to the reforms being implemented through the existing environmental reform process that are necessary to reduce environmental risks and impacts associated with the hydraulic fracturing of unconventional reservoirs to acceptable levels; and
  6. identify priority areas for no go zones.

When the Inquiry makes a determination under Item 1 about whether or not there has been an impact or risk on economic, cultural and social conditions, the Inquiry will not only consider the impacts and risks of hydraulic fracturing and the Associated Activities, it will also consider the impacts and risks of the development of the onshore unconventional gas industry, including exploration activities such as seismic surveys and aerial surveys, land access and costs and benefits of the industry. This may be undertaken through a social impact assessment or similar activity.

## **METHODOLOGY**

In the course of delivering the Terms of Reference, the Inquiry will:

1. advise the timeframe for the Inquiry prior to 1 January 2017;
2. develop and implement a stakeholder engagement program, which will be publicly released prior to 1 January 2017 and which will include opportunities for the public to give written submissions and meet with the Inquiry in Darwin, Katherine, Tennant Creek and Alice Springs (and potentially other communities) prior to and following:
  - a. the release of an Interim Report on the Findings of the Inquiry; and
  - b. the release of a draft Final Report on the Findings of the Inquiry;
3. have regard to issues raised in the course of implementing the stakeholder engagement plan that relate to the Terms of Reference;

4. subject to any request for a submission or any part thereof to be kept confidential, make all submissions to the Inquiry publicly available;
5. have regard to relevant domestic and international reviews and inquiries regarding the environmental impacts and risks associated with hydraulic fracturing of unconventional reservoirs and the Associated Activities;  
and
6. consider the principles of ecological sustainable development and the precautionary principle.

**Terms of reference: Inquiry into political donations**

I move that the Northern Territory Legislative Assembly appoints a person under section 4A of the Northern Territory *Inquiries Act* to inquire into and report on options for the reform of political funding and donations in the Northern Territory by no later than 12 months from today, including:

1. Should there be a cap on how much parties can spend on a campaign, how it should be calculated and what other details should be considered.
2. Whether or not 'full' or 'partial' public funding of political parties and candidates should be provided.
3. If a 'partial' public funding scheme is considered preferable, recommendations as to a potential model, the basis upon which such funding is to be provided and whether a threshold for such funding should be adopted (consideration should extend to any legislative/regulatory amendments that would be required to affect such a model).
4. What is the appropriate level to cap the value of political donations to parties, groups, candidates, elected members and third-party campaigners; what methodology should be used to determine that cap; and what measures can be put in place to ensure that any caps are effective.
5. Whether the current donations disclosure requirements are appropriate including potential changes to the method, timing and publication of disclosures.
6. What controls should apply to the making of political donations, including:
  - i. whether or not particular entities or groups of donors should be excluded; and
  - ii. any limitations or restrictions or caps on such political donations.
7. Whether there have been any breaches of the Northern Territory *Electoral Act* in relation to donations made to political parties and candidates in the Northern Territory over the last 10 years.
8. Any legislative or regulatory amendments that should be made to ensure that limits on political donations and disclosure requirements cannot be avoided through the use of third parties, associated entities or other means. To this end the inquiry will investigate:
  - i. The structure of Foundation 51 and the scope of its activities;
  - ii. The relationship between Foundation 51 and the Northern Territory Government and its Agencies and any related conflicts of interest;
  - iii. The relationship between Foundation 51 and the Country Liberal Party and any related conflicts of interest;
  - iv. The extent of direct and indirect financial and in-kind support provided by Foundation 51 to the Country Liberal Party, Members of Parliament and candidates for Parliamentary elections;
  - v. The extent of breaches of the Northern Territory *Electoral Act* and any other Territory legislation by Foundation 51; and
  - vi. The activities of Harold Nelson Holdings and its compliance with the Northern Territory *Electoral Act*.
9. Any other matters relevant to political funding and donations.
