1. Bi-Partisan Delegation to Canberra - Family, Domestic and Sexual Violence

Notice given by: Ms Uibo

Date: 26 November 2024 Status: To be moved:

That the Assembly:

- Formally acknowledge the unacceptable rates of domestic, family, and sexual violence within the Northern Territory and:
- Endorse the formation of a bipartisan delegation to Canberra, comprising members of the CLP Government, the Labor Opposition and the crossbench, standing alongside victim survivors, DFSV experts and frontline workers. The purpose of this delegation will be to advocate for significant federal investment in initiatives aimed at combating domestic, family and sexual violence, underscoring our collective commitment to addressing this critical issue.

2. Environmental Protections

Date: 16 October 2024 Status: To be moved:

That the Assembly:

- Recognises the importance of safeguarding the Territory environment for future generations and in support of our Territory lifestyle.
- Reaffirms support for the critical environmental protections the former Labor Government put in place including a contemporary *Environment Protection Act* best practice regulation for the environmental impacts of mining, the Climate Change Response: Towards 2050 policy; and The Territory Water Plan.
- Commits to not undermining watering down or changing our strong legislative and regulatory regime of environmental protections.

3. Aboriginal Remote Housing Program

Date: 16 October 2024 Status: To be moved:

That the Assembly calls on the CLP Government to:

- Commit to the full implementation of the \$4 billion Aboriginal Remote Housing program.
- Guarantee that the target of a minimum of 2,700 houses built over ten years is met.
- Commit that no amendments will be made to this agreement without the full support of the Joint Steering Committee of Remote Housing Northern Territory.

4. Improving integrity in Parliament

That the NT Legislative Assembly:

- Recognises the importance of integrity in our parliamentary system both to ensure that decisions are made in the best interests of Territorians and to ensure that there is public trust in our democratic processes.
- Acknowledges that public trust in politics is at an all-time low and this is due to the influence of lobbyists and vested corporate interests on our politics.
- Urges the CLP Government to honour their election commitment and catch up to the rest of the country by establishing a lobbyist register.

5. Objectives of the Aboriginal Justice Agreement

That this Assembly recommit and affirm the objectives of the Aboriginal Justice Agreement, that by 2027 the NT Government

- Reduce offending and imprisonment of Aboriginal Territorians.
- 2. Engage and support Aboriginal leadership.
- 3. Improve justice responses and services for Aboriginal Territorians.

6. Voluntary Assisted Dying

Notice given by: J Davis

Date: 22 October 2024 Status: To be moved:

That this Assembly:

- Acknowledge the important and extensive work of the Voluntary Assisted Dying Independent Expert Advisory Panel in producing the Report into Voluntary Assisted Dying in the Northern Territory.
- Recognise the right for Territorians to end their lives with dignity and the immense suffering that is caused for them and their families when this right is taken away from them.
- Recognise that the Northern Territory, the first jurisdiction in the world to legalise voluntary assisted dying, is now the last in Australia to pass this law.
- Urge the Government to implement the 22
 recommendations of the Report into Voluntary Assisted
 Dying in the Northern Territory, acknowledging that many
 Territorians, from all political persuasions want the right to
 die with dignity in the Territory.

7. Economic Development and Infrastructure Program

Date: 16 October 2024 Status: To be moved:

That the Assembly:

- Acknowledges the outstanding work done by the private sector in developing a portfolio of projects valued at over \$57 billion spanning critical sectors such as minerals and resources digital innovation, renewable energy and agribusiness.
- Commends the 2024-25 Northern Territory's infrastructure program for its significant contributions to building a better Territory, fostering economic development, and improving the quality of life for all Territorians.

8. Family, Domestic and Sexual Violence

Notice given by: J Davis

Date: 26 November 2024 Status: To be moved:

That this Assembly:

- Recognises that all members of this Assembly have firmly committed to addressing family and domestic and sexual violence (FDSV) as a priority.
- Acknowledges that domestic, family and sexual violence is our true crime and safety crisis, and that this crisis disproportionately impacts Aboriginal women in the Northern Territory.
- Recognises the findings of the "Coronial Inquests into the deaths of Kumarn Rabuntja, Kumanjayi Haywood, Miss Yunupingu and Ngeygo Ragurrk', which highlight urgent reforms needed to protect Aboriginal women and children from domestic, family and sexual violence, and ensure victims are seen and heard;
- 4. Commits to fully resourcing and implementing all recommendations of the Coroner arising from these Inquests as a matter of urgency;
- 5. Further commits to working in partnership with Aboriginal communities and frontline services to ensure effective implementation of these reforms.

This Assembly stands united in addressing the domestic, family and sexual violence crime and safety crisis, and ensuring all women and children are safe, protected, and supported.
