## **Todd Mall Security**

- 1. How does the foot patrol operate in the Todd Mall?
- 2. What are the requirements of this patrol under the contract?
- 3. What hours does the patrol operate?
- 4. Who do the officers report incidents to?
- 5. What is their relationship with Police?
- 6. How many CCTV cameras operate in the Todd Mall?
- 7. Who monitors those CCTV cameras?
- 8. In the last 12 months how many crimes have been prevented as a result of the CCTV?
- 9. In the last 12 months how often has the footage from these cameras been used as evidence in crimes?
- 10. Is there any discussion afoot to bring back the monitoring of the CCTV cameras to Alice Springs and to have local Alice Springs people monitoring these cameras?
- Todd Mall uses independent security contractor, Talice Security Services (TSS). The Northern Territory Police Force is unable to comment on TSS operations and procedure within the Mall. But Talice have a close working relationship with Police and attend Police briefings on the Mall. Additionally, Northern Territory Police also conduct regular foot patrols in the Mall plus hot-spot patrols.

- 4. Any incidents warranting police involvement are reported through regular police reporting channels via the Joint Emergency Service Communications Centre (JESCC).
- 5. The security staff have a positive and interactive relationship with police, often attending the station to discuss trends to assist in their concentrated patrols on evening shifts.
- 6. There are currently five cameras that operate within the Todd Mall that are both operator-controlled and have a large field of vision.
- 7. These cameras are monitored by CCTV Operators from the JESCC located in the Peter McAulay Centre, Berrimah.
- 8. CCTV operators regularly request and / or direct police patrols based on live observations to disrupt criminal behaviour, however the amount of crimes prevented is unknown and difficult to quantify.
  - Nonetheless, it is apparent that the presence of CCTV is, in itself, a powerful disincentive to potential offenders.
- 9. Six exhibits have been retained for incidents in the Todd Mall to be used as evidence in current investigations, however this does not include real-time footage used to track offenders or direct units to persons of interest as per question 8.
- 10. There is a monitoring station located at the Alice Springs Police Station. Alice Springs police members have the ability to monitor all cameras in the Alice Springs Police CCTV network.
