## Answer:

The Department of Mines and Energy's Legacy Mines Unit (LMU) and the Mining Remediation Fund is a proud initiative of this government. Prior to this initiative, no official list of legacy sites existed.

There are many hundreds of sites with legacy issues across the Territory. A priority of the LMU is to complete an inventory of Legacy Mines Sites that will identify the key legacy sites.

There is only one true abandoned legacy site which is located approximately 100km south-east of Darwin.

In the 2015-16 financial year, the LMU commenced eight key projects:

Hatches Creek - Safety Works

Tennant Creek - Safety Works in the Eldorado area

Tennant Creek - Peko Dust Study

Tennant Creek - Eldorado Weeds Survey

Redbank - Sump and pump installation
