## Answer:

On 22 May 2013 Notification of Increase in Market Rent letters were sent to 280 tenants aged 55 and over, with recorded incomes exceeding the eligibility limit for public housing.

These tenants were classified as ineligible at 20 May 2013 and were invited to visit their local housing office with up to date income and asset details to enable re-assessment to determine whether they are required to continue to pay full Australian Valuation Office market rent or are eligible pay rent based on 30% of their income (whichever is lower).
