ANSWER:

- **Details of private providers of VET in the Northern Territory?**

As the Department of Education and Training enters into legally binding contracts with registered training organisations, it is not possible to individually name the private providers accessing government funding or elaborate on the details of each training contract.

The details of funding provided to Charles Darwin University and Batchelor Institute of Indigenous Tertiary Education can be accessed in their annual reports.

The following table provides an overview of the number of private training providers accessing funding under the five major VET programs.

General Recurrent VET	4	\$1.2m
User Choice (Apprenticeship/Traineeship Training)	56	\$5.7m
Productivity Places Program	30	\$5.1m
Indigenous Responsive Program	46	\$2.3m
