Question:

Can you inform us of how many hooning offences occurred this financial year up until this date? What were the results of those offences?

Answer:

In the 2018-19 financial year to end March, 57 infringement offences were detected for hooning, compared to 70 in the same period the previous year.

In the 2018-19 financial year to end March, 50 apprehension offences (offences dealt with by arrest, summons or notice to appear) were detected for hooning, compared to 61 for the same period the previous year.

Hooning offences are detailed in the Traffic Regulations and include:

- Participating in speed trails or races (s37(1A));
- Driving a vehicle to cause loss of traction (including burnouts) (s37A(1)); and
- Damaging the surface of a road or public place (s37B (1)).

Data was extracted from the Department of Attorney-General and Justice's Integrated Justice Information System (IJIS) on 11 June 2019 and may differ from data extracted on a different date.
