### **Victim of Crime Survey**

In August 2020, the Greater Darwin, Road Safety and Support Command sought to establish a Victims of Crime survey (VOC Survey) to allow community members to provide feedback to the NT Police after reporting a crime. The VOC Survey allows victims of crime to identify how their call for assistance was managed, as well as the level of service provided by the attending police member/s.

The survey was hosted on the agency website as a standard form; however, additional reporting functionality needed to be built to provide meaningful analytics of the data. Upgrades to the website reporting capability incurred costs of \$1,500.00 (inc GST).

### **Victim of Crime Survey**

Following a brief trial period, the Victim of Crime Survey (VOC Survey) was launched publicly on 16 February 2021.

The initial direction from the Assistant Commissioner Greater Darwin, Road Safety and Support Command was for sworn members, specifically officers in charge of major centres and senior sergeants and remote localities, to contact ten victims of crime per week and complete the online survey. The members could either complete the survey on the victim's behalf or direct the victim to the survey on the website. No inducements were offered.

The survey has yet to be actively promoted through social media platforms, but a communications plan is underway to proactively market the availability of the VOC Survey.
