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Worker and Wellbeing Fund Advisory Group**Terms of Reference****Purpose**

The Worker and Wellbeing Fund (the Fund) is to support local workers struggling with the economic effects of COVID-19. The Fund's main goals are to:

- Help people access the range of wellbeing and other counselling or support services that are available
- Help people navigate the welfare system and access income and any other financial support available
- Help workers who have lost their job find new employment opportunities fast – such as guiding people to job matching services like the Territory Jobs Hub
- Assisting Territorians who require access to accommodation and other essentials.

The impact of COVID 19 has meant uncertain times and many Territorians have lost jobs or are feeling insecure. This program will enable more people to access the support they and their families may need during this time. For some people it may be the first time they have needed to access support services such as financial counselling or navigate the Centrelink system. As well as ensuring people stay physically healthy during this time, we also acknowledge the importance of emotional wellbeing and mental health.

This funding is to meet new and emerging gaps and will be available for people who were not already receiving Centrelink benefits such as Newstart or Youth Allowance prior to the COVID-19 economic downturn. It will also be complementary to any initiatives announced by the Australian Government.

Objectives

The objectives of the Advisory Group are to:

- provide wellbeing information to their members regarding available support;
- provide advice to the Advisory Group on issues raised by their members;
- provide recommendations to government on allocation of funding; and
- provide advice to the Advisory Group on identified needs gaps.

Resources/Budget

- Secretariat support will be provided by the Department of the Chief Minister.
- The Advisory Group itself has no operational budget. Operational expenses will be met by the Department of the Chief Minister.
- The Advisory Group will not be responsible for managing the budget for the Fund.

Governance

- Meetings will be chaired by a Chairperson who is independent of Government.
- Meetings will be held as required and determined by the Advisory Group.
- The Advisory Group will report through the relevant government structure (as determined on a case by case basis) and report to the Minister for Territory Families.

Scope

The Advisory Group is not responsible for project delivery and will not assume responsibilities that lie with NT Government agencies and/or service providers.

Membership

Membership of the Advisory Group:

- will be established by the Minister for Territory Families in consultation the independent Chair, depending on identified strategic objectives of the Fund; and
- will include relevant representatives from the non-government, community and private sectors as deemed appropriate.
