It undertakes licensing and compliance activities across liquor, tobacco and gambling services, in accordance with multiple legislative frameworks, ensuring community safety and regulatory integrity.

In support of a thriving tourism sector, the Department actively promotes diverse and sustainable visitor experiences. It works in close partnership with local businesses and industry stakeholders to build capability, strengthen service delivery and foster regional economic development.

The Department also manages, maintains and monitors the Northern Territory's parks and wildlife estate. Through conservation initiatives and responsible land management, it safeguards the Territory's unique natural and cultural assets while providing safe and accessible opportunities for recreation, education, and connection to Country.
