EC0090 **New Temporary Red Tape Task Force to review legislation, regulation and administrative arrangements**

Updated: 19/05/2014 **Completed:**

Summary: The Red Tape Abolition (RTA) Squad will develop and deliver the NT's ambitious red tape reduction and deregulation program over 3 years.

Detailed: Action to establish the RTA Squad currently being initiated includes:

- formation and recruitment of the Squad;
- preparation of RTA Strategy and 3 year implementation plan;
- research into best practice red tape reduction and deregulation action in Australia and internationally;
- planning for the review of NT legislation; and
- development of engagement and consultation plan involving industry associations, business, agencies, other governments and NT statutory and advisory bodies.

The development of the RTA Squad complements the wider red tape reduction and related action already underway, such as:

- the work of the Red Tape Reduction Advocate and toll-free agency hotline;
- development of the proposed NT Civil and Administrative Tribunal;
- major deregulatory reform to the NT Licensing Commission legislation and licensing red tape reduction and to government procurement;
- effective regulation impact processes in the NTG; and
- significant red tape process improvements and reforms across government, including high risk licenses, criminal history checks, apprenticeship arrangements and gambling and liquor licence services.

EC0091 **New Independent Procurement Board and Chairman to draft new guidelines**

Updated: 19/05/2014 **Completed:**

Summary: In December 2013 Cabinet approved an extensive package of government procurement reforms structured in two tranches. Appointing an independent Chair of the Procurement Review Board was included.

Detailed: Tranche 1, which has been deferred to 1 July 2014, includes reducing the number of procurement tiers from six to five and increasing thresholds, making business transactions with the NTG's procurement system easier, simpler and more transparent, changing the role of the Procurement Review Board, increasing agency authority and accountability, improving procurement governance structures, and clarifying local development and value guidelines to assist NT based businesses win government contracts. Tranche 2, now scheduled for implementation from the second half of 2014 onwards, will address further procurement system enhancements including development of a forward procurement plan, completion of a comprehensive modernisation of the Procurement Directions, updating standard conditions of contracts to align with contemporary industry and commercial standards, specific procurement training for NTG officers and continuing consultations with industry stakeholders. The procurement red tape reduction reforms integrate with other reforms being developed, including the formation of the NT Civil and Administrative Tribunal, and the NT Licensing Commission reforms. On 17 February 2014, Cabinet Ministers were asked to nominate suitably qualified individuals for the Minister for Business to consider appointing as Chair of the Procurement Review Board. DoB is compiling a list of potential candidates and an appointment is expected to be made in conjunction with the implementation of Tranche 1 reforms on 1 July 2014. The former Chair, Mr John Montague, has resigned from the NTPS, and Ms Allison Grierson of the Department of Health has been appointed as Acting Chair in the interim.

EC0092 **Reconfigure and streamline DBE**

Updated: 19/05/2014

Completed:

Summary: A new strategic plan will be developed over the coming months to guide delivery of government priorities, but also to ensure DoB's activities reflect the needs of the business community and industry.

Detailed: DoB comprises former units of the Department of Business and Employment, and the Department of the Attorney-General and Justice. Functional responsibilities from other agencies have also been transferred to DoB since it was formed in September 2012 (ie. development functions from Tourism NT and Regional Development, and Alcohol Policy from Health). The Gambling and Licensing Services Division of the Department has finalised its structure that will see a more effective service delivery, and ultimately lead to a separation between the licensing/authorisation function and the compliance function when an integrated database is implemented. Restructuring to a full licence/compliance model cannot be achieved operationally until such time as the new database is implemented. The Employment and Training arm has been split to focus on Business Engagement and Strategic Policy in two divisions. NT WorkSafe has been configured to support business.

EC0095 **Re instate social clubs and poker machines in some communities**

Updated: 19/05/2014

Completed:

Summary: Most remote communities are in alcohol protected areas. Licenses to operate poker machines can only be provided to those who also hold a liquor licence.

Detailed: The Australian Government has jurisdiction over liquor licenses in alcohol protected areas under the Stronger Futures in the Northern Territory Act. The previous Australian Government Minister for Families, Housing, Community Services and Indigenous Affairs made a decision to not approve any changes to, or issue new liquor licenses in these communities. Following the Federal Election in September 2013, and the change in Government and Minister, this could provide an opportunity for the NTG to further discuss this matter with the new Government/Minister.

EC0097 **Expand Small Business Advisory Service to help remote communities**

Updated: 19/05/2014 **Completed:**

Summary: DoB now has officers equipped to deliver business support services throughout all regions of the Northern Territory for Indigenous and non-Indigenous business clients.

Detailed: There are Territory Business Centres located in Alice Springs, Tennant Creek, Katherine and Darwin that provide one-stop-shop information and licensing services for NT business. DoB also has officers positioned across the NT delivering targeted advisory and support services to businesses in regional and remote areas. The former Indigenous Business Development and Indigenous Tourism Business Development units have been subsumed into DoB, and are now aligned with mainstream business support activities providing an enhanced suite of programs and support available to their business clients. Increased business support programs now include:

- the Business Growth Program which delivers support for business workforce development, technology development, business planning and marketing;
- ecoBiz Program has been expanded with two officers to help service the Top End and one officer now based in Alice Springs to service Central Australia;
- Indigenous Business Tendering Support Program to directly assist Indigenous businesses build capability and capacity in tendering for Government and major project work;
- NGO Business Support Program – one year pilot program aimed at building the capacity of local NGOs to function as independent, financially viable businesses;
- Tiwi Islands Economic Development Program – providing a business support and facilitation presence on the Tiwi Islands to promote business, economic and localised employment opportunities; and
- Gove Business Assistance – providing a senior client manager presence to directly support Gove business through its transition phase.

EC0098 **Reduce business costs - red tape, carbon tax, skilled worker programs**

Updated: 19/05/2014 **Completed:**

Summary: Business costs continue to rise due to the fiscal position of the NT Budget and the continued pressures from the Commonwealth Government.

Detailed: The carbon tax repeal action has commenced in the Federal Parliament. Progress of the repeal legislation is being monitored; implications for NT business will need to be assessed. In response to programs for more skilled and trained workers, in 2013-14, a total of \$93.5 million will contribute to the delivery of training and support of the VET sector, including;

- \$61.65 million committed to VET recurrent funding for Charles Darwin University, Batchelor Institute of Indigenous Tertiary Education and other service providers to deliver a range of VET programs and infrastructure in urban, regional and remote locations;
- \$27.78 million committed to train and support apprentices and trainees;
- the 2013-14 Worker Attraction Program is designed to profile work opportunities in the NT to interstate and international workers to help fill the local workforce shortages and broaden the NT's labour and skills pool. In 2013-14 it consists of a range of online, national and international activities;
- in respect of the NTG's election commitment to 'develop programs for those affected by carbon tax', the business growth program now provides for grant support to enable consultants to deliver Environmental Risk Management Plans to businesses. The ecoBiz program assists businesses to adopt resource efficient practices that are good for their financial bottom line and the environment;
- a key outcome of the program for business is the ability to access quality advice and assistance through a free site survey; and
- the ecoBiz NT site survey looks to provide business with a statement of quantified energy, water or waste within its operation and potential eco-efficiency opportunities. Efficiency opportunities through behavioural change, installation of controls or infrastructural/equipment upgrades or retrofit are identified and quantified back to the business.

EC0100 Scrap Banned Drinker Register

Summary: The NT Government has not yet given direction to the Department of Business to proceed with amendments to the Liquor Act to either alter the requirement or remove the Banned Drinker Register entirely.

Detailed: The Director of Licensing authorised an Instrument temporarily exempting licensees from scanning ID for the purposes of checking against the Banned Drinker Register. The current exemption is valid until August 2014. Exemptions will need to continue to be authorised by the Director of Licensing, 12 monthly, until the Liquor Act is amended to either remove or alter the requirement for takeaway licensees to scan IDs.

EC0089 **New Small Business Task Force**

Updated: 10/12/2013 **Completed:** 31/07/2013

Summary: The Small Business Taskforce comprises a team of staff who operate within the Business Liaison and Support Branch of the Department of Business.

Detailed: Department of Business (DoB) Client managers routinely visit and engage with members of the small business community and gauge business and local economic conditions and seek out impediments to doing business. The branch has also established a bi-monthly pro-active sensing program of surveying business owners on a sector by sector basis where economic, business conditions or systemic issues are detected (such as alleged red tape) and brought to the attention of relevant government areas. This initiative is useful for exploring the results of the business Sensis surveys for investigating regional business conditions/climates.

The Small Business Taskforces regularly reports on business confidence and through bi-monthly sensing on feedback from different key industry sectors.

DoB has also established a 'quick response' business sensing mechanism to quickly engage sectors of the economy where a Northern Territory or Australian Government policy shift is under consideration.

Complementing the above, DoB has established a Business Advocate role (EC01) to address red tape who follows up on adverse issues arising and delivers a service to business people experiencing difficulties in obtaining decisions, licences, approvals or information from Government.
