Grant Recipient: Ali Curung Council
Project Name: Cultural Exchange Project
Funding Amount: \$15,000
Project Description: A cultural exchange program aimed at providing youth with a platform of options to divert them from the criminal justice system.

Grant Recipient: Alice Springs Town Council
Project Name: Safety Lighting - Snow Kenna Reserve and Anzac Oval car park
Funding Amount: \$8,500
Project Description: Install safety lighting aimed at reducing anti social behaviour associated with substance misuse.

Project Name: Secure! - Dagaragu Community Recreation Hall Rehabilitation
Funding Amount: \$15,000
Project Description: Upgrade the recreation centre to enable activities as an alternative to crime/anti social behaviour.

Project Description: Involve Lajamanu, Kalkaringi and Dagaragu youth in a program to teach basic horse riding, animal husbandry and rural station skills in order to help reduce crime and anti social behaviour and increase employment opportunities.

Project Name:	Cross Cultural Youth with Leadership Program
Funding Amount:	\$15,000
Project Description:	This project aims to create a better cross cultural understanding between migrant and ethnic youth resulting in a greater understanding of values and background, greater respect for each other and an improved societal contribution.
Grant Recipient:	Binjari Community Government Council
Project Name:	Wylamba Night Patrol
Funding Amount:	\$13,943
Project Description:	This project aims to purchase radios and other equipment for the Night Patrol, enabling them to more effectively prevent and address incidents involving assault, domestic violence, and other anti social and criminal behaviour.

Project Name:	Night Patrol Legal Skills Workshop
Funding Amount:	\$13,000
Project Description:	This project is a joint initiative between Tangentyere Council and the Institute of Aboriginal Development. This is the second series of an NTsafe funded program of legal skills training workshops for remote area night patrols.

Project Name:	Ltyentye Night Patrol and Community Services
Funding Amount:	\$15,000
Project Description:	This project aims to reduce the incidence of substance abuse, dangerous driving, accidents, and domestic violence through funding of the night patrol.

Project Name:	Tiwi Island Local Government
Funding Amount:	\$14,460
Project Description:	This project aims to reduce anti social behaviour at Nguiu Community and divert youth away from drugs, alcohol and gambling through the provision of alternative activities. These activities will include alcohol and drug awareness dance and movie nights and under age discos. As part of the project local young people will be trained as projectionists, disk jockeys and ground crew.

Project Name:	Stopping Violence through Alcohol Awareness
Funding Amount:	\$15,000

Project Description: This project will utilise the services of the Aboriginal Islander and Alcohol Awareness Family Recovery Program to develop a community strategy for dealing with alcohol, drug abuse and associated violence. Two residential camps will be held, for youth and adults, to focus on ways to implement the strategy in the community.

Project Description: This project aims to reduce criminal and anti social behaviour, and substance abuse amongst indigenous Arrernte youth through youth participation in a music and sport activity program.

Project Name: Extension to Basketball Court Roof
Funding Amount: \$7,500
Project Description: This project aims to provide diversionary activities for youth in order to discourage involvement in anti social behaviour, substance abuse and criminal activity. This will involve extension of the existing roof of the youth centre to enable activities to occur in wet weather.
